## Texas Board of Professional Geoscientists

Licensure as a Professional Geoscientist (P.G.) is required by the Texas Geoscience Practice Act to offer or to engage in the non-exempt public practice of geoscience in Texas. A firm or corporation offering or performing non-exempt public geoscience services is required to be registered as a geoscience firm.\*

<sup>\*</sup> A Texas Board of Professional Engineers (TBPE) licensed Professional Engineer (P.E.) may offer/perform public non-exempt geoscience services as long as the P.E. performs or takes responsible charge of the services and signs and seals the work. A TBPE-registered Engineering Firm may offer/perform public non-exempt geoscience services.
