

# Texas Board of Professional Geoscientists

Licensure as a Professional Geoscientist (P.G.) is required by the Texas Geoscience Practice Act to offer or engage in the non-exempt public practice of geoscience in Texas. A firm or corporation offering or performing non-exempt public practice services is required to be registered as a geoscience firm.\*

License REQUIRED</b> —Professional geoscience services provided for or submitted to government agencies. —Consulting, investigation, evaluation, analysis, planning, mapping, inspecting geoscience work. —P.G. or P.E. Seal must be on work that requires a license. —Geoscience (or Engineering) Firm registration information required (including firm registration number). <b>P.G. License NOT required:</b> —Federal projects and employees, oil & gas exploration and development, mining, teaching and research, archaeology, court testimony, possibly on-site sewage disposal.
